Ministry Challenges Highlighted in Titus

- -divisive people
- -doctrinal deviancy
- -enormity of the task
- -generational, economic, and social diversity
- -gossip and loose talk
- -legalism
- -social ostracism
- -spiritual warfare

Preaching Emphases in Titus

- -magnify God's grace (1:4; 2:11; 3:7,15)
- -prioritize [doctrinal] preaching (1:3,9; 2:1,15)
- -emphasize character before conduct (1:5-9)
- -glory in the Gospel (2:11-14; 3:4-7)
- -revel in the Second Coming (2:13)
- -invest in the next generation of preacher-pastors (1:4-5,9;3:12-13)

Preaching the Epistles

- -examine the canonical "neighborhood" (phrase, sentence, paragraph, chapter, section, book, Testament, Bible)
- -follow the textual pattern of this specific genre of the text (epistle)
- -establish the pericope (complete unit of thought)
- -look at the complete sentences of the text
- -prioritize and examine the verbs (load-bearing words)
- -check for supporting clauses (e.g. purpose clauses, hinα)
- -identify the main theme or big idea
- -cross the homiletical "bridge" from the "then" of the biblical world to the "now" of the contemporary world
- -formulate the outline (usually structured around sentences or emphases in the text)
- -work toward sermon alignment between the title, sermon main idea and outline
- -flesh out each point by explaining, illustrating, and applying
- -write out the sermon introduction and conclusion

Sample Sermon

Overwhelmed By God's Grace

Titus 2:11-15

Big Idea: Overwhelmed by the grace of God's Son, our lives should look like Christ. Overwhelmed by God's grace means that we:

1. Live like Christ, 2:11-12

—Grace is a major theme of Titus. The word occurs 4x (1:4; 2:11; 3:7,15). Paul never forgot or took for granted God's grace that was extended to him and placed him in the ministry (1 Cor. 15:10; 1 Tim. 1:11-13).

2. Look for Christ, 2:13-14

—The book of Titus references the appearing of Christ 3x (2:11 [grace],13 [glory]; 3:4 [kindness and love]). The blessed hope (2:13) of the Second Coming of Christ loomed large in the lives of believers in the early church.

3. Labor in (the Word) of Christ (2:15)

- —Preaching is a prominent theme in Titus (1:3,9; 2:1,15). Paul planted the church in Crete through the preaching of the Word (1:3). He summons Titus to his task of preaching to restore order to the church. Such preaching would produce bold living, longing, and leading.
- —The apostle uses 3 terms to describe the preaching task: "speak [laleo] these things, exhort [parakaleo], and rebuke [elegcho] with all authority" (2:15). These tasks embody the specific, nuanced purposes of preaching. Sometimes, the preacher speaks or teaches; at other times he exhorts or encourages; and, finally, circumstances might require rebuking or reproving.
